


A Portion of "Let America Be America," by Langston Hughes

They provide hands-on educational programs to teach parents and adults with limited food budgets how to shop for and cook healthy meals. The Food Bank also offers a free Culinary Job Training program to people seeking employment in the food service industry. And they maintain a production garden with the goal of providing fresh produce for the culinary program and their soup kitchens, and educating people on how to maintain a garden. Alison's Legacy


Alison Nyhan was an integral and beloved member of our South Church Community, and she is missed by all.
