

Hearts in the Ash

Although it's happening to all of us, I've been feeling the onslaught of age a bit more than usual lately. Some of it has been the effect of Alison's death: I still expect to see her whenever I'm passing by her office, and her death simply reminds me of my mortality. Some of it is noticing my Parkinson's symptoms creeping in ever so slightly. Time marches on whether we agree to it or not.

Last night about thirty of us gathered to mark the beginning of the Lenten trek to Holy Week we call Ash Wednesday. Because yesterday happened to be Valentine's Day as well, I offered people the option of getting the mark of a heart on their forehead instead of the traditional cross. Most people chose to receive a cross, but a few opted for the heart. The hearts didn't look like much other than a triangular smudge, but their effect has lingered on my mind.

Even a brief look at the ash heap of history will affirm human mortality and our propensity for sometimes getting things royally wrecked. Hearts get broken every day. War never seems to take a break. The rich get richer, and the poor get poorer. We track the ash of ourselves and our sin around wherever we go, not noticing the trails we leave. And yet, our trail of ashes is also the proof we have of having been alive at all!

Look closely, and every now and then you'll notice in your ash trail the outline of the tracing of God's finger in the shape of a heart. It's one of God's ways of saying, "I have loved you since before you were born... why do you think I would stop loving you now?"
