### **Lent: Lighting the Way**

"Your word is a lamp for my feet, a light on my path." Psalm 119:105

There is, in the practice of centering prayer, an exercise known as "returning to the breath." When the mind wanders, or pressing thoughts bang on the door demanding our attention, we are invited to turn our attention back to our breathing, to stay focused on the most basic, life-giving dimension of the human body. Good breathing, as with good eating, increases our ability to focus, our energy, our sense of peace and our availability to God and to one another. The simple gift of focus is life-giving.

More than anything these days, we need to hone our ability to focus, not only on our breathing, but on God's presence and leading. With bad news lurking around every racial, economic and political corner, whether our goal be to simply survive the day or to bring light into the darkness, we will need to focus more than ever on the good news that God would have us share in the world.

Our Lenten theme is Lighting the Way, and together in our worship and in our work, we will tend to the light of God's love as it seeks to reside in us so that we may help carry that light into the present darkness; to help light the way into a world that is less afraid, less angry, less polarized and more just.

The racial justice task force at South Church was born in the aftermath of George Floyd's murder and the global outrage that followed.



After reading Ibram X. Kendi's book, *How to be an Anti-Racist*, we have been gathering regularly to lay the groundwork for South Church to become a racial justice church. The January 6th siege of our Nation's Capitol; the emboldened resurgence of white supremacy; and other hate groups have made all the more clear just how much work our country has to do to confront and heal the racism in our midst. ## **Memorial Prayer Beads**

It is almost a year that we have been learning how to navigate this pandemic. As a way to honor those who have died, we are working to create prayer beads to display outside the church by March 13th. Each prayer bead will include a bell or charm representing each individual and an additional twelve beads to represent the year we have all endured. Our goal is to

create a string of beads for each individual that has died. As of January 28th, 1004 Granite State Residents have died from Covid. If you are interested in helping out stop by the church to pick up a kit in the side entrance by the parking lot. Also if you have beads you would like to donate to this ministry, please feel free to drop them off at the church. We will take any beads, plastic, wood, metal or glass.

## **Let There be More Light**

The Property Stewardship Ministry is undertaking two projects to enhance the lighting in our buildings and to protect our assets:



The first project involves the restoration of all of our stained glass windows and the replacement of plexiglas coverings. We hope to protect the windows in the coming years. The cost of restoring each of the large Sanctuary windows is approximately \$4,000. The cost to restore the three large windows facing Pleasant Street will be approximately \$20,000. The cost to restore the other smaller windows on the bell tower and elsewhere are somewhat less.

The second project involves the replacement of all the lights in the Sanctuary and Parish House with new LED

fixtures or LED light bulbs. The total cost of the lighting project is approximately \$22,250. (Approximately, \$7,550 will be funded with a grant from Unitil; an additional \$7,000 of the cost will be paid for using the Church's annual distribution from the Mosley Trust; which leaves an unpaid balance of approximately \$7,700 to be paid by the Church over the next five years.) We expect that our energy savings will offset this repayment obligation.
